THIS Volume deals only with the Maps and Plans of the Valley and City of Mexico, beginning with a Pre-Columbian Plan of part of the City, and ending with a Map of the Valley compiled from the latest surveys.

The hope is entertained that it may be published in time for the Session of the Congress of Americanists, which will be held in the City of Mexico in September, 1910, and may help to direct attention to the many obscurities in the topography of the Ancient City, some of which can be cleared up by observers on the spot.
